STATE QUESTION NO. 833
LEGISLATIVE
REFERENDUM NO. 376

This measure adds a new section, section 9E,
to article 10 of the Oklahoma Constitution.
Section 9E will permit the creation of public
infrastructure districts to provide support,
organization, operation, and maintenance of
services. To create such a district, proponents
for creating the district must file a petition with
the municipality. The petition must include the
signatures of one hundred percent of all
surface property owners falling within the
district's proposed boundaries. The
municipality possesses the right to impose
limitations on the district's powers prior to
approving the district. Once approved, the
district will be governed by a board of trustees.

Through the board, the district may issue
bonds to pay for all or part of all public
improvements implemented by and for the
public infrastructure district. The district will be
limited to issuing bonds issued for such
improvements not exceeding ten (10) mills. For
repayment of the bonds, the district, acting
through its board of trustees, will levy and
assess a special assessment on all property
benefiting from the improvements in the
district. Section 9E also authorizes the
Legislature to enact laws necessary for the
implementation of public infrastructure
districts.
